Development of reading strategies on major specific texts, description and comparison, word formation, prefixes, suffixes, modals, phrasal verbs, passive and infinitive constructions, complex sentences and conjunctions. <i>Practical instruction</i> Practice of communication skills (oral and written) on professional topics, development of reading strategies, grammar comprehension. Interactive approach: discussions, role-plays, individual work, group work, audiovisuals, written and oral assignments.
