The outcomes in the teaching of geography. Overview of didactic principles in the teaching of geography. A brief overview of the development of geography in the world and Serbia. Subjective factors of teaching - teacher and student. The basic teaching facilities and resources for teaching and learning geography. Geographical teaching tools.Geography textbook and didactic apparatus in geography textbooks. Organizing and teaching.Types of classes. Forms of teaching geography (frontal work, group work, pair work, individual work, team teaching, programmed teaching). Special forms of education (additional, optional, extension, leisure activities, geographical excursions).Methods of teaching geography (monologue, dialogue, conversation, text, illustrative-demonstrative, showing method, simulation method, the method of observation). Correlation of teaching methods. Curriculum, planning of teaching (annual, monthly, daily). Preparation of teachers in the teaching of geography. Making preparations for the class. School administration. Forms of geographical checking. Evaluation. The motivation of teachers and students in teaching geography.

## Practical instruction

In the practical exercises, students will be through research projects and seminar papers elaborate on particular issues of methodology of teaching. Also, they will carry out curriculums and daily preparation for the classes.
