Learning outcomes Students should develop basic and specific abilities of critical thinking, connecting different phenomena, mastering the analysis of the topics on academic level, finding suitable solutions for specific problems; reviewing the situation and basic trends in sports and recreational tourism.

The role of sports and recreation in tourism development and vice versa. Economic and socio-cultural impacts of sports and recreational tourism. The impact of sports and recreational tourism on the environment. The element of health in sports and recreational tourism. Knowledge about managing and planning sports and recreational tourism. Sports and recreational tourism in the 21st century. <i>Practical instruction</i> Analysis of the topical issues through statistical and graphical indicators and specific examples (case studies), which imply writing essays or papers and their oral presentation.
